This half-term, the whole school has learnt three new tricks to help us with our confidence and feeling calm:



Mirror Mirror taught us the importance of saying nice things to ourselves, especially if we are feeling like there is something we are finding challenging. Emily T in 3BF says, "When I was starting roller skating I felt a bit scared. To help me, I could say to myself, "You are great, you can do hard things - all it takes is a bit of practise!"



Big Voice is a trick that encourages us to create a positive self-belief mindset through how we talk to ourselves. We practised using our voices to tell ourselves, "I can do it and I feel strong inside!" Ottollie in 5E says, "If I was feeling nervous, I would tell myself I can do it, there's nothing to be nervous about!"



Stand as If teaches us that we can trick our minds into thinking that we are feeling confident by standing strong and tall. Changing our posture affects how we feel! Anna in 4S says, "If I am doing a show at my theatre group, I feel a bit worried sometimes before I go on stage so I can use Stand as If to trick my mind into thinking that I am feeling brave!"

Year 6 Football

On Friday 4th October, twelve year 6's played in a 9-aside football tournament at Tillingbourne. Their first match was a close 4-1 loss against Tillingbourne, then they drew 0-0 against St.Barts.
