#### Safer Internet Day 2025

The week before half term provided the opportunity for a discussion about staying safe online and the theme this year was Scams. In assembly, we discussed what a scam is; what to look out for; how and why people do this; and what to do when these situations appear online. We discussed that it was unlikely a random stranger would come up to anyone in the park and offer them free cash or gadgets without us thinking it was strange. As a consequence, we might want to consider whether we click on links offering similar prizes in games without reflecting on who put it there and why. We discussed the idea that companies and others may want to gather personal data for marketing or scamming, plus the risk of downloading a virus from the link. Please take this opportunity to talk to your children about spam and links to online prizes and what they should do if they come across them.

#### Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel 2025

This year we have signed up to take part in the Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel between 24th March and 4th April! The aim of the challenge is to inspire families to make more active journeys by walking, wheeling, cycling or scooting to school, which not only boosts health, but also improves air quality and makes a difference to the world around us.
