Friends of Busbridge School / PTA

Our school PTA does a tremendous job supporting the ongoing work of the school. They do so much to enhance the experiences of your children at BJS. Thank you, as ever, to everyone who helps out in large or small ways.

From September we are in need of a new PTA Chair. Sarah Speirs, our current Chair, is standing down as her BJS child moves on to secondary school in September. We have not yet been able to find a parent to take on the Chair role, so please have a think as to whether now is your time to take on this essential role. Air-Up Drinks Bottles

As mentioned before Easter, from September 2023, we ask that Air-Up drinks bottles stay at home. We know they are popular with some children, but they are also very pricey. Often in class we need to look after them more carefully because they are expensive, and this is often just another thing for teachers to keep an eye on. Cheaper water bottles may not be as tasty, but they are just as effective in carrying water. We appreciate that parents may have already bought them, hence the delay in asking them to stay at home.

Drop-Off Box

This way of passing forgotten items to your child during the school day is proving to be effective. The Drop-Off box can be found inside the school fence. Just reach through, open the lid and drop the item in. It is checked regularly so there is no need to inform the school office. However if it is a pricey or essential item (e.g. glasses) please do use the buzzer to tell the office that it is there.

Pet Day - Monday 12th June

Pets are welcome in school on this day. Dogs in the afternoon and any other pet in the morning. Most pets will need to be accompanied by an adult please (e.g. cats, sheep, rabbits) but some smaller pets could possibly be left in school and collected later (e.g. stick insects). We can be flexible with timings, so if as a parent you can only bring Tiddles the cat in from 10.45 to 11.15 we can work with that. More details to follow, along with a reply slip so we know what we are letting ourselves in for!

Vaping

Some of our older children have been discussing vaping as part of our Science / PSHE lessons. Interestingly, some of the children were unaware of the health issues around vaping. Worryingly, some of the children said that older children had offered them / encouraged them to vape when out and about (e.g. up at Busbridge rec). These may be topics you wish to discuss at home with your children.

Uniform Update

Parents will have received an email yesterday detailing our new uniform policy and supplier, which come into effect from September. On Thursday in assembly, we discussed why wearing uniform is beneficial. Laila in 5GT gave us a fantastic reason: *"In the word uniform is the word 'uni', which means united, unity, equal together.... We wear school uniform to be EQUAL! United with uniform".*

The cycle training aims to improve balance and control skills (e.g. steering, using gears, looking all round whilst keeping control and controlling the cycle with one hand) and at the end of the course everyone was proud to walk away with their level 1 badge!
