We hope you all enjoyed the sunny Bank Holiday weekend after the excitement of Star Wars day last Friday. What a fabulous time we had on May the 4th : thanks to everyone for entering into the spirit of it. In particular thanks to Judo Pete for putting us in touch with the Little Musketeers who run a primary school fencing programme.

## Lunchtime organisation in school

In assembly, Mrs Barker has led the children in a review of our lunchtime organisation. This was also an opportunity to remind the children of expectations for their conduct on the playground and the way in which they interact with each other. The purchase of foam rugby balls for the playground was well received by the children, as

was the introduction of year group footballs to ensure that when it is a particular class or year group football "TOGETHER LUNC day, the children have a ball that they CAN BE HAPPY TIMES" are responsible for looking after and



are able to play with. We have also introduced a new and exciting program of lunchtime sporting activities led by Bill Bingham, whereby each year group will have a lunchtime session to take part in a team game or sporting activity on the field should they wish to join in. The 'fifth day' is an opportunity for the children to participate in a range of House sporting events organised in part by their peers and preparation for inter school activities. These resources are all funded by the Sports Premium budget that the school receives.

## Teaching of Reading Audit by Education Consultant

The school was recently visited by Heather Retter, an education consultant who is working with the school to audit our teaching of reading and to deliver training to our staff. Mrs Barker and Miss Warner took her around the school to



observe reading sessions being taught. Whilst she was able to give us a comprehensive evaluation of the teaching of reading which was overwhelmingly positive, she also commented on the high levels of engagement of children in ALL classes, as well as complimenting us on the behaviour of each and every class. Coming from a professional who spends time in numerous schools this is praise indeed. We are very proud of all of the teachers, LSAs and children.

#### Visit to school by author Maria Farrer

Last week Y4 were treated to a visit by the author Maria Farrer and her life-sized polar bear cut-out! Maria spent time with each class discussing her passion for polar bears and the research she has carried out to enable her to write about animals and the ways they communicate non-verbally. She discussed her writing process reminding the children of the magic behind writing, saying 'when you write you can be anyone, anywhere, doing anything', as well as the importance of the 'loathsome' yet necessary skill of editing! Maria was incredibly impressed with the children's inquisitive nature and knowledge they shared on important issues e.g. global warming.
