#### Reminder - New fees for Breakfast & After-School Club

Following a review of our Breakfast and After-School Club fees by the school's Governing Body, please note that there will be a 5% increase from Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024. Whilst the governors had hoped to avoid raising fees, unfortunately the costs of running the club (staffing, food, heating) have continued to rise over the last year, and we do need to pass some of those costs on via this increase. The prices per session effective from 16<sup>th</sup> April 2024 will be as follows:

- Breakfast club £6.40 increased from £6.10
- Half after-school club £8.10 increased from £7.70
- Full after-school club £16.20 increased from £15.40

Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any queries, or if you feel you will be severely impacted by this increase. Any concerns will be treated with the utmost confidentiality.
