# Bringing forgotten items to school

Our office staff play an integral role in the day to day running of the school as well being responsible for finance, first aid/ medicines, school wide communication, ordering and many more crucial aspects of school life. To enable us to support them in carrying out their wide range of roles we are going to trial a new system for parents who need to drop off forgotten items for their child during the school day. If your child forgets their coat, water bottle, PE kit, pencil case or other piece of equipment and you wish to deliver it to them in the school day, after Easter you will not need to buzz the gate and speak to the office. Instead, there will be a box placed just inside the gate, but reachable from outside, into which you can deposit your child's forgotten item. This box will be checked by our Year 6 Prefects at break time and again at lunch each day, and any named items will then be delivered to the children's classroom. This new system should (i) promote more independence for children, (ii) still enable forgotten items to be brought in if needed, (iii) ensure that our wonderful office team can focus on the myriad of tasks required of them on a daily basis. We will trial this system in the summer term and see how we get on!
