



Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRFs)

Know number bonds to 20

I know the 2 times table (× and ÷)

Know doubles and halves of numbers up to 10

I know the 10 times table (× and ÷)

I know the 5 times table (× and ÷)

I can tell the time to the nearest 1/4s and half past minutes

I know number bonds for each number up to 20

I know the 3, 4 and 8 times table (× and ÷)

Consolidate 3,4,5,8x tables

I can tell the time to the nearest 5 minute

I know halves and doubles of all numbers up to 20 (e.g. double 10=20 Half of 9 =18)
