# Heath Lane - Drop off and Pick up

It has been brought to our attention that some parents/carers are parking their cars on Heath Lane at drop off and pick up times. Heath Lane is the lane to the left of the school as you drive out on to Brighton Road. Heath Lane is very narrow and residents have reported to us that on several occasions they have been blocked coming out of their driveways by parked cars, or have been unable to drive down. The neighbouring farmers have also been affected. Please can we ask that parents/carers do not park on Heath Lane and instead either use the village hall car park (during the designated times) or park considerately away from the school and walk across.

# Village Hall Car Park - can you help?

The Village Hall allow our parents to use their car park for morning drop offs and afternoon pickups, however this comes at a financial cost to our school. So that we can continue to provide this facility, we need to ask parents who use the car park to consider making a voluntary contribution of £15 per year towards these costs. If you are able to make this voluntary contribution, we ask that you log into your child's Arbor account and select Village Hall Car Park Contribution under 'Clubs' to make your payment.

Like most schools our budget is under enormous pressure and it is hard to fund even the basics. Your support with this contribution will help our school funding go further for the good of the children.

# Mr Stuart's Grueling Race!

Last Friday at 12:00, Mr Stuart set off on the Arc of Attrition, a grueling 100-mile foot race along the Cornish coastline. The night before, Storm Éowyn battered the area, bringing 70mph winds and torrential rain.

Taking a cautious approach, Mr Stuart started towards the back of the pack, steadily overtaking around 200 runners throughout the afternoon and night. Unfortunately, at around mile 30—just after enduring an hour-long storm of high winds and sideways rain—he slipped and landed awkwardly. However, a few miles after leaving Land's End, his knee became increasingly problematic. At mile 62, with the most technical section of the course ahead, he was forced to withdraw.

Undeterred by this setback, Mr Stuart is determined to return to Cornwall one day to complete the race!
