## Pupil premium grant expenditure: 2015/16

Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools and academies to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. It was first introduced in April 2011. Since then the amount schools and academies receive has increased. Schools and academies will receive funding based on the number of pupils who have been eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. The Government believes that the Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage pupils reaches those who need it most. Each school may decide how best to use the funding and they are held accountable for how it has been used to support pupils from low income families

## Summary of PPG spending 2015/16

#### **Objectives in spending PPG:**

Set realistic objectives that focus on specific groups of pupils or subjects. If you want to focus on mathematics, you may want to monitor progress in average point scores to show progress.

To ensure that children in vulnerable groups make comparable progress to their peers in school and nationally

To ensure that children who have emotional and mental health needs are supported through a caring and nurturing environment at school, enabling them to make expected progress at school.

To give support to children who have emotional and behavioural difficulties and who have experienced significant trauma which may affect their ability to access the curriculum

Summary of spending and actions taken:

- HSLW working with vulnerable children 1 x morning per week for 1:1 sessions
- Nurture room set up at lunchtimes to reduce incidents of physical behaviour on the playground from children who find the playground difficult.
- Playtime games resources purchased to help children engage in meaningful play at playtimes.
- 1:1 support for vulnerable pupils at playtimes
- 1:1 art sessions with children who with emotional and communication difficulties
- Provision of milk for children eligible for FSM
- Interventions in Maths and Literacy
- Homework club provision
- Staff training attachment, bereavement
- Clubs and school trips for disadvantaged children.

#### Outcomes to date:

- New HSLW worker appointed for Sep 2016
- Nurture room set up toys/ activities purchased and member of staff employed for every lunchtime.
- Playtime games resources purchased to help children engage in meaningful play at playtimes.
- Provision of milk for children eligible for FSM
- Homework club provision continues with more children being offered a place
